Key Duties & Responsibilities

- Plan and deliver fun, structured, and age-appropriate dance sessions.
- Teach a variety of dance techniques and support young people to develop their skills.
- Motivate participants, encourage creativity, and build confidence through movement.
- Ensure sessions are safe, inclusive, and appropriately risk-assessed.
- Support young people with diverse needs and adapt activities as required.
- Promote positive behaviour, teamwork, and respect within the group.
- Prepare for performances, showcases, or events where relevant.
- Communicate effectively with young people, parents/carers, and team members.
- Maintain accurate attendance records and report any concerns following safeguarding procedures.
- Represent Starpic Project with professionalism, enthusiasm, and a commitment to youth development.
